

PAINTING

Waste Water Pollutes

ONLY rain down the drain.



Allowing paint or painting waste water to enter the storm system is illegal. (KCC 12.30.020)
It's your job to prevent waste water from entering storm drains.

Smart Paint Clean Up

Dispose of waste water into a toilet, utility sink, or sewer cleanout.

Never wash out equipment or dump waste water on the street, down storm drains or ditches.



Bring to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility for disposal or reuse at the swap shop.

Mix with kitty litter to solidify. Place in trash with lid off.

Air dry. Place in trash with lid off.

Oil based paint and paint thinner

Businesses—Call Kitsap 1 for an appointment.

Residents—Bring leftover oil-based paint and paint thinner to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility.

Smart Pressure Washing Practices

When pressure washing try to use only water

Place a filter over or create a barrier around nearby storm drains

If You Spill...it's your responsibility to:

Promptly clean up

Keep a spill kit on hand to deal with spills. Train your employees to use the kit and keep records of employee training
